#### 6. SCOPE OF WORK

#### Background:

DART is seeking a vendor to paint select interior spaces at DART Central Station, located at 620 Cherry Street, Des Moines, IA 50309. The interior spaces to be painted are those marked as "FY20" on the floor plans attached to this Request for Quotes. Work to be completed includes, but is not limited to:

#### **Project Manager:**

The Project Manager for this project is Ben Cross, DCS Building Supervisor.

#### **Description of Work:**

- Examination of wall surface to identify any areas which need patching or repair. Patch or repair as needed.
- Preparation of area to include:
  - o Remove hardware, covers, plates, and similar items already in place that are removable and are not to be painted. If removal is impractical or impossible because of size or weight of item, provide surface-applied protection before surface preparation and painting. After completing painting operations, use workers skilled in the trades involved to reinstall items that were removed. Remove surface-applied protection if any.
  - Protect windows, floors, furniture, and installed fixtures or equipment from paint splatter.
  - Clean substrates of substances that could impair bond of paints, including dust, dirt, oil, grease, and incompatible paints and
    encapsulates.
  - Remove incompatible primers and re-prime substrate with compatible primers or apply tie coat as required to produce paint systems indicated.
- Apply two (2) coats of paint according to manufacturer's written instructions. DART will supply the paint.
- At the end of each work day, remove rubbish, empty cans, rags and other discarded materials from project site.
- At the completion of project, remove all painter's tape, tarps, and job supplies; remove rubbish empty cans, rags and other materials from job site.

As an independent contractor, Contractor shall, at its sole cost and expense, provide all labor, materials, equipment, tools, supplies and incidentals necessary to perform this Contract in the manner and to the full extent as set forth in the Contract Documents

#### **General Contractor Responsibilities:**

- Obtain, at their own expense, any and all permits and inspections necessary to complete all work contained in the attached specifications
- All work will comply with Federal, State and local codes and regulations.
- Repair/Replace, at contractor's own expense, any damage to DART property by contractor's employees. Replacement or repair will be at replacement cost value.
- Remove, at contractor's own expense, all debris related to the project
- Adhere to DART safety requirements/protocols (PPE is to be worn at all times while on DART property)

• Costs incurred to comply with this requirement will be the responsibility of the Contractor.

#### Davis Bacon Wage Act:

Repairs to DART buildings, including painting, which exceed \$2,500 are subject to the Davis Bacon Wage Act. If the lowest quote received exceeds \$2,500, the Contractor will be responsible to comply with all stipulations of the Davis Bacon Wage Act. The Wage Determination which would be applicable to this project has been attached.

#### Safety Requirements:

- All costs for compliance with these safety provisions are the responsibility of the Contractor.
- Contractor shall ensure that all employees, independent contractors, and subcontractors on site are wearing all OSHA required Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for their trade and the work being performed.
- All workers within DART property, must wear high visibility clothing when on the DART Central Station boarding platform area. High visibility clothing is not required for Contractor personnel working indoors. High visibility clothing or high visibility safety apparel is personal protective safety clothing that is intended to provide conspicuity during both daytime and nighttime usage. High Visibility safety apparel must meet the Performance Class 2 or 3 requirements of the American National Standards Institute/International Safety Equipment Association (ANSI/ISEA) 107-2004 for High-Visibility Safety Apparel and subsequent revisions thereof.
- Contractor and subcontractors shall comply with OSHA and reporting maintain an OSHA 300 log.
- Contractor shall have an English speaking supervisor on site at all times when work is being performed.
- Contractor shall have a site safety plan which includes, site safety orientation, tool box talks, material delivery schedule, and work attire review.
- Initial site safety orientation and tool box talk for each employee, independent contractor, or subcontractor will be documented.
- Contractor shall have a plan in order to protect DART employees and members of the public from harm.
- Accidents or incidents will be communicated to the DART Supervisor on site. The DART Supervisor will take charge of responding to or documenting accidents or incidents in accordance with DART policies and procedures.





Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198

indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date

for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

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#### WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- \* an existing published wage determination
- \* a survey underlying a wage determination
- \* a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- \* a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.
